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Background

BOSTON Institute Of Natural Medicine is the first online herbal college established to provide training in herbalism based exclusively on Jamaican and caribbean herbs. BOSTON Institute of Natural Medicine was founded by well known herbalist Dr. Ben-Yisrael (Marlon Hurlock).

HOW LONG IS THE PROGRAM?

Our first program is our Diploma in Traditional Carribbean Medicine which is 46 weeks long (40 weeks of theory and 6 weeks of practical clinicals) *where persons will be unable to attend our 6 weeks internship program other means of assessment will be made available.*

HOW WILL THE PROGRAM BE ADMINISTERED?

Our teaching model is based on an online collaborative learning environment that promotes peer-to-peer learning and utilizes open-source technology along with open educational resources. Which means there are no text books for the program and students work at their own pace. We utilize Moodle, a powerful learning management system that provides a platform for e-learning. The curriculum is offered weekly and students must complete all activities in order to complete a module



The theory aspect of our program will be 100% online-based and will take the form of:

- Webinars
- Reading Assignments
- Workshops
- Group Forums
- Peer Reviews
- Video Reviews

Our classes run from Monday-Sundays, as soon as Sunday 12:01 am hits, all assignments and activities would have become due. Two courses will be offered each week, persons will be given a week period to submit a request to drop one class and only carry one course if they believe two courses per week may be too much for them.

WHAT ARE THE OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE AFTER COMPLETING THIS COURSE?

Natural medicine is not a regulated industry, but there is an increasingly high number of persons turning to herbal medicine for their health needs. With that comes a huge opportunity to start a new career in what me become a vibrant industry. 6 WEEK INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Students will also get an opportunity to conduct actual clinics from consultations to formulating medicine and wellness protocols and finally client reviews.
